It was heartwarming celebrating our first *Rosh Hashana* together in our sanctuary! I got chills when Cantor David led us in a spirited *Shehechyanu* prayer as we brought in 5786 together in our very own space in which we have been blessed to pray, celebrate, eat, and mourn for nearly a year. It takes a village and I'm deeply grateful to our founding members who do much behind the scenes to make our High Holy Days so very special.

I am also thankful to those of you who graced our bimah during our High Holy Day services, from chanting Torah and Haftorah, blowing shofar, taking aliyot to the Torah and ark openings, and to those of you in "the pews." It's wonderful witnessing each of you enjoying being part of our special synagogue community.

Ten days after Rosh Hashana we observe Yom Kippur. It is customary to wear white on this holy day. There are different explanations for this tradition. White clothing represents a kittel, a plain white shroud in which traditional Jews are buried. Plain white garments for everyone, rich and poor, highly educated or high school dropout, reminding us that we are all equal before G-d. Another explanation is that we wear white to be like angels, longing to ascend toward the Divine, to be more transparent and lighter. Please feel free to wear whatever feels meaningful to you; just want you to know why you may see some of us in white!

May we each be inscribed in the Book of Life for a year of health, peace, and meaning, Rabbi Deborah



After the services, the congregation held a lovely outdoor Tashlich ceremony, using birdseed since there was no nearby water. Initially, the weather was beautiful and sunny, but it quickly turned dark, and light rain began as we finished singing "Eli, Eli." We returned to the synagogue, continuing to sing, and then enjoyed a communal Rosh Hashanah lunch, marveling at the divine timing of the events.
