As we get older, time seems to fly by faster than when we were younger. Lately, I've been curious why this is so. According to psychologist Marc Wittmann, "Our retrospective sense of time hinges on memory: Periods rich in novel, significant experiences feel longer, while routine collapses duration. This principle could explain the age effect on subjective time. Childhood, adolescence, and early adulthood overflow with 'firsts'—biological and psychological leaps, new skills, new places, new relationships—each adding weight to memory. As the years pass, routine gradually displaces novelty, and even changes in jobs or travel cannot recreate the intensity of early milestones. With fewer meaningful events experienced, subjective time accelerates as we grow older."

I appreciate the many sacred days our Jewish calendar provides us to celebrate, and the beautiful memories we create as a *Shaarey Tzedek* community each time we are together. With no disrespect to Dr. Wittmann, I believe that if we are mindful, we can have meaningful experiences throughout our lives. There is a Latin phrase which translates as, "It's ordinary to love the beautiful, but it's beautiful to love the ordinary." As we age, may we find more beauty and meaning in the routine of our lives, Rabbi Deborah
