Little did I know when I was making the Shehecheyanu papercut to decorate for our Shavuot service that we would be commemorating a double Shehecheyanu evening. In addition to observing Shavuot, we were 38 strong at our Friday evening Shavuot service! What a joy to celebrate together, actively nurturing a thriving Conservative Jewish community in Montgomery County.

June ushers in the Hebrew month of Tammuz. According to legend, on the 3rd of Tammuz, G-d caused the sun and moon to pause, miraculously manifesting 36 hours of sunlight. This gave the Israelites time during daylight to fight the five armies which attacked the Gibeonites, whom Joshua had been tricked into protecting. This is described in Joshua 10:12-14 and may be the earliest recorded solar eclipse. Or more precisely, according to Cambridge researchers, this passage from Joshua may document the annular solar eclipse that took place on October 30, 1207, B.C.E. Interestingly, these Cambridge researchers state that an independent source, the Merneptah stele, documented that the Israelites were in Canaan between 1500 and 1050 B.C.E., a fascinating potential verification of a biblical event!
