My Jewish Journey By Sol Sachs

My Jewish Journey spans 85+ years. I was born in Houston 1937 in an all-Jewish neighborhood. Kosher butcher & grocers. Our family kept kosher and my dad put on tefillin every morning. We went to orthodox shuls with my dad from the time I could walk. When I was 10 we joined Congregation Beth Yeshurun, where I participated in junior congregation & choir. During those years I studied under Cantor

Wagner, and learned to lead services when he was absent. I met a little girl named Arlene Horwitz. We became instant friends and when we became teenagers, we both joined B'nai Brith Youth organizations. Arlene & I were inseparable during those teen years, & we married when Arlene was only 18 and I was 20.

We kept a kosher home & stayed close to our Judaism. Soon Ron came along & Sheryl. We were a close family & did everything together. They were both active in B'nai Brith Youth. Our house was always filled with kids during their teen years.

After moving to the Woodlands in 1987 we found a small Jewish community. We participated in services & all their activities. I was in the choir for 20 years & I lead services for Rabbi when he was away. Arlene ran the gift shop & co-founded their women's group. We started the Sachs Mitzvah Fund, which provided holiday boxes for college kids & Oneg for once-amonth Shabbat Services.

In 2000 our cousin in Port Arthur called to say their synagogue was closing. We were able to purchase their pulpit chairs, a torah, & many other religious items. 11 years ago we became involved with Rabbi Mendel & Leah at Chabad. I enjoyed attending services, reading haftorahs, while Arlene enjoyed working with Leah on many fun projects. We donated many

items, including a new Torah. I celebrated my 2nd Bar Mitzvah there.

In 2021 I met a very special group of dedicated couples who realized it was time for a Conservative Congregation in Montgomery County. After many months of planning, Shaarey Tzedek was formed, and the rest is history.

Arlene & I have spent our lives immersed in our Jewish religion. It has guided our path through life, giving us meaning and purpose. It is my hope we can pass this wonderful way of life on to future generations.
